City Honors Walk-to-School Day Poster Contest Winners

Perris elected officials this week honored two children who submitted the winning entries in a poster contest to celebrate the 2015 International Walk-to-School Day.

Rebecca Rooney, 8, a third-grader at Avalon Elementary School, and Elias Juarez, 10, a fifth-grader at Triple Crown Elementary School, were feted Oct. 13 at the Perris City Council meeting.

The youngsters and their parents met Perris Mayor Daryl Busch, who presented them with plaques and gift baskets, which included gift cards to the recently opened Super Walmart.

Rebecca's poster featured a girl and boy walking to school near a field of grass under a morning sun. A student in Avalon's gifted and talented program, Rebecca enjoys drawing going crafts and playing the Minecraft video game. Her favorite subject is science.

Mom Belle Drumal and dad Anthony Drumal accompanied Rebecca to the podium. Belle Dumal said her daughter was more than pleased to learn she took top honors in the poster contest.

Buttons depicting Rebecca's artwork were created as part of the City's third annual participation in the Oct. 7 International Walk-to-School Day, which promoted exercise in more than 20 countries around the world. Thousands of Perris students in eight schools took part in this year's event.

"Great job all the way around," Rogers said.




