YAC Holds Holiday Food Drive for Senior Citizens

The Perris Youth Advisory Committee is conducting a holiday food-drive to brighten the upcoming holidays for the City's underprivileged senior citizens.

Collections already are pouring in to support the food drive and people interested in supporting the drive have until Dec. 14 to drop off a wide-range of fresh, canned and boxed items at the Perris Senior Center, 100 North D Street.

The center will be open from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. that day.

"This is a wonderful effort and we are so proud of our Youth Advisory Committee for stepping up and helping out our needy seniors," said Perris Senior Center Recreation Leader Jessica Munoz. "They are a great group of young adults who are interested in helping our City in any way they can."

Munoz said the Senior Center is accepting a wide assortment of donated foods—turkey, ham, gravy, macaroni and cheese, mashed potatoes, stuffing, butter, hot chocolate, yams, salads, pies, soups and pasta. Boxed and canned foods and beverages also are part of the food drive.

YAC members Aasiyah DeAndrade, 16, Jenna Owens, 16, Viviana Pavon-Cortes, 16, and Jacqueline Reliford, 15, are spearheading the collection drive, which to date has collected more than 700 cans and packages of food and \$300 in

"It's nice to see everyone helping out," she said.


