Youth Advisory Committee Teens Serve Seniors

Teen-agers from the City's Youth Advisory Committee brightened the holidays for dozens of seniors by providing the ingredients for several tasty meals with contributions from Perris residents, schools and businesses.

More than 30 senior citizens lined up Dec. 23 to select from a variety of canned, bagged and boxed food items to prepare for their holiday meals.

In addition to collecting hundreds of containers of macaroni and cheese, corn, beans, pasta, peanut butter, tomatoes, cranberries, stuffing, gravy and other assorted products, the YAC representatives also raised \$540 in cash contributions. With that, the high-schoolers went out and purchased 70 chickens to serve as the centerpiece of the holiday meals.
