## Spring Egg Hunt Brings Out Smiles and Community Spirit

Volunteers from the City of Perris, local schools, Girl Scout troops and community helped turn the annual Spring Egg Hunt at City Hall from another community event to something eggstraordinary.

Perris City Councilman Julio Rodriguez and City Clerk Nancy Salazar helped check in folks who had registered to take part in a breakfast buffet that included a yogurt bar loaded with healthy fruit choices.

Rodriguez also touched based with several vendors who provided food gift cards, thanking them for supporting a yearly City event that always draws a huge crowd.

High-school students from the City's Youth Advisory Committee helped feed the crowd of more than 350. Girl Scouts and chaperones from several Perris troops kept the hunting grounds—mazes of hay bales set up in front of City Hall—well stocked with eggs sought out by eager children.

Rodriguez commended City staff for including healthy fruits and yogurt into the breakfast menu. Nutritious food choices represent a pillar in the City's "Live Well Perris" ongoing healthy-eating active-living campaign, which continues April 26 with a Community Health Fair from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. at City Hall, 101 North D Street.

"We are not just talking the talk, we are walking the walk," Rodriguez said. "Events like our egg hunt draw so many divergent people. These are the kind of events I went to before I was elected to the City Council. It's incredible."

Eduardo and Jessica Ocampo chaperoned their daughter, Jasmine, 7, and 11 other youngsters from Girl Scout Troop 95 who worked the egg hunt. The day showed the value of community spirit and volunteerism. It was also fun.
