New Perris assistant finance director Jennifer Erwin has been on the job for just a short time but she already feels the positive vibes from her staff, other municipal employees and the City's elected leaders. Erwin, who grew up in Beaumont, Texas, and graduated from college in California, joined the City after eight years as assistant controller with the Morongo Band of Mission Indians.

She said she likes the duties and responsibilities of her job—keeping track of City expenses and sources of revenues like grants, developer fees, property and sales tax receipts—and knowing that Perris long has been recognized for its commitment to top-notch financial management.

The City has for eight consecutive years has been honored by the Government Finance Officers Association with it Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting.

The award honors the City's commitment to go "above and beyond" the minimum requirements of accepted accounting principles to prepare comprehensive statements that showcase "the spirit of transparency and full disclosure."

Erwin said she knows receiving such accolades doesn't come easily but continue that string of excellence is a challenge she's willing to embrace.
