## Residents Celebrate Annual Snow Day in Perris

Try telling the 400 children who took part in Perris' annual Snow Day that all the fuss was just about frozen water.

The City trucked in 21 tons of snow for the event and staff from the Public Works and Parks and Recreation departments turned Foss Park into a winter wonderland, constructed a small hill for youngster to sled down and arena to frolic in the snow.
