## Perris Senior Citizens Honored on Annual Recognition Day

The City of Perris paid its respects to senior citizens, particularly the ones who make the golden years a little more golden for their peers by volunteering at the Perris Senior Center.

This year's annual Senior Recognition Day drew more than 70 people who help call out Bingo numbers, organize Bunco games, help package and distribute food to less fortunate residents and assist in line-dance classes.

Senior volunteers were treated to lunch and received certificates of appreciation from the City. Three members of

Center, the City of Perris and the entire Perris Valley. The Senior Center also received accolades from the Riverside County Board of Supervisors and the Riverside County Advisory Council on Aging.
