## Fun Run Raises Money for Hungry Seniors

More than 150 bikers, runners and walkers took part in a fund-raiser at the Lake Perris State Recreation Area to help ensure homebound senior citizens receive hot and nutritious meals delivered to their homes.

In the end, the 2nd Annual Family Service Association Fun Run and Bike Race raised more than \$4,000 to feed hungry seniors.

Event organizers lengthened the distance of the competitive bicycle race from 20 to 30 miles and riders from throughout the Inland Area arrived at sunup to tackle the course that stretched around Lake Perris and into City streets.

"I just wanted to come out and help support a good cause," Trenado said after the race. "The competition was tough. These guys rode strong. It was a blast. Next year we will do it all again."

Air Force Master Sgt. Carlos Diaz of Perris, who has served in Afghanistan and Iraq, said he was glad to take part in a good cause.

Anthony Pena, of Riverside, said he was eager to take part in any event designed to help make life a little easier for seniors. FSA representatives say they feed 1,200 seniors, many homebound or with limited mobility, daily in Riverside County.
