The Perris Senior Center earlier this month threw a lunch and awarded Certificates of Acknowledgement for the people who work at local food banks, teach arts and crafts, provide paralegal services and call bingo games—some of the easily forgotten services that make life a little more enjoyable.

About 60 senior citizens took part in the luncheon, which also featured a raffle of prizes.

"Everyone wants to be acknowledged for the good work they do," said Yavonne Sims, Senior Center Coordinator. "None of these folks get paid. They do what they do out of the goodness of their hearts."

Among the honorees was Daphne Williams, who received a certificate for her 15 years work with the Brown Bag Food Bank. The volunteer group gathers, sorts and bags excess produce and grocery commodities for distribution to the less fortunate. Twice a month, volunteers gather at the Perris Seniot Center for this important work.

Williams said the staff members at the Senior Center, particularly Sims and her assistant, Cynthia Quintero, make the work enjoyable.

"I love them like my granddaughters," she said. "Every time I come here, you see them greeting people with a big welcoming smile. They make you feel so special."
