Purpose of the Project:

This City project will be adding Low Water Landscape improvements within the medians on Ramona Expressway between Redlands Avenue and Lake Perris Drive. These improvements include planting drought tolerant trees and shrubs, and adding other decorative features such as boulders and cobblestone. Also included in this project is a bioswale.

A bioswale is a natural way of using rock filters and plants to clean runoff before it enters into the groundwater or our storm drains. So, this project will not only be a beautiful addition to Ramona Expressway, but a functional one as well.

Funding:

This project is Funded by the Environmental Enhancement and Mitigation Program.

Why are the lights flashing red?

Due to the high volume of traffic

on Ramona Expressway, the lights will be flashing when crews are onsite to keep both the Contractor and the public safe.

The lights will not be flashing outside of work hours or the weekends.

How long is construction going to last?

The project construction is anticipated to last 3 months.
