RESOLUTION NUMBER 5678

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PERRIS, APPROVING A SUBSTANTIAL AMENDMENT TO THE 2019-2024 CONSOLIDATED PLAN AND FY 2019-2020 ANNUAL ACTION PLAN TO INCLUDE FUNDING FOR THE E-LEARN PROGRAM.

WHEREAS, the City Council must approve substantial amendments to the City's Five-Year (2019-2024) Consolidated Plan and Annual Action Plan (FY 2019-2020), including the reallocation of unexpended Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds; and

WHEREAS, the City of Perris, pursuant to Federal regulations has solicited public input to the amended 2019-2024 Consolidated Plan, FY 2019-2020 Annual Action Plan, and Citizen Participation Plan to include programmatic funding for the E-Learn Program in the amount of \$16,000; and

WHEREAS, the City Council must find that under the Federal guidelines established by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), that the reprogramming of unexpended funds will meet federal reallocation criteria including: reprogramming the unexpended activity funds to eligible uses that meet the low/mod area or low/mod clientele national CDBG Objectives; and ensuring that funds being reprogrammed will not exceed the statutory limits for Public Service activities set forth by HUD; and ensuring that projects receiving reallocations are ready to move forward and be completed, with environmental clearance; and

WHEREAS, on June 9, 2020, the City Council conducted a duly noticed public hearing in which it accepted public input and considered the substantial amendments to the 2019-2024 Consolidated Plan and FY 2019-2020 Annual action Plan; and

WHEREAS, the approvals herein are final for the inclusion of the E-Learn Program funds in the amount of \$16,000 in the 2019-2024 Consolidated Plan, FY 2019-2020 Annual Action Plan; and

WHEREAS, the 2019-2024 Consolidated Plan and FY 2019-2020 Annual Action Plan are planning documents and are not subject to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) as they would not result in a direct or reasonably foreseeable physical change in the environment pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines 15060 (c)(2) nor considered a project pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines 15060 (c)(3).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Perris, as follows:

Section 1. The recitals set forth above are true and correct, and incorporated herein by this reference.

- **Section 2.** That the City Council has determined that the 2019-2024 Consolidated Plan and FY 2019-2020 Annual Action Plan are planning documents and are not subject to CEQA pursuant to Sections 15060 (c)(2) and 15060 (c)(3).
- **Section 3.** That the City Council hereby approves the inclusion of the E-Learn Program funds in the amount of \$16,000 in the 2019-2024 Consolidated Plan and FY 2019-2020 Annual Action Plan.
- **Section 4.** That the City Council authorizes the City Manager, or his designee, to take all necessary and appropriate actions to carry out this Resolution, including, but not limited to, submitting the amendment of the 2019-2024 Consolidated Plan and FY 2019-2020 Annual Action Plan to the Department of Housing and Urban Development; executing all documents related to the 2019-2024 Consolidated Plan and FY 2019-2020 Annual Action Plan; and any related administration thereof, for the following:
 - 1. The addition of \$16,000 in unexpended FY 2019-2020 funds to the 2019-2024 Consolidated Plan and FY 2019-2020 Annual Action Plan to allow for the E-Learn Program

Section 5. That the City Clerk shall attest and certify to the passage of this resolution and it shall thereupon take effect and be in full force.
