RESOLUTION NUMBER 3834

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PERRIS, COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, APPROVING TWO STREET VACATIONS LOCATED AT STATE HIGHWAY 74 AND ARAPAHO ROAD AND MAKING FINDINGS IN SUPPORT THEREOF

- **WHEREAS**, a proposal to vacate two street easements more commonly described as Street Vacation 06-0327, located between APN # 313-151-003 and #313-153-001, and Street Vacation 06-0328, located between APN #313-153-001 and 313-153-002; and
- **WHEREAS**, there are no underground utilities in the drainage easement that would be adversely affected by the vacation; and
 - WHEREAS, this Street Vacation has been duly noticed; and
- **WHEREAS**, the City Council has determined that the requested street vacations are in the public interest; and
- **WHEREAS**, all legal prerequisites for the adoption of this Resolution have occurred; and
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the City Council of the City of Perris, California, as follows:
- **Section 1.** The City Council has considered and hereby adopts the findings of fact set forth in the above recitals.
- **Section 2.** The City Council has reviewed and considered the environmental information included in the staff report and accompanying attachments prior to taking action on the application for the proposed project, and finds that Street Vacation Nos. 06-0327 and 06-0328 are exempt pursuant to Section 15061(b)(3) of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines (Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations), in that it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the street vacations could have a significant effect on the environment.
- **Section 3.** Based upon the information contained within the staff report and the accompanying attachments with respect to the Street Vacations, the City Council hereby finds the following:
 - A. The proposed project is consistent with the General Plan.
 - B. The existing underground utilities will not be negatively impacted by the proposed street vacation.

- C. The project will not affect health, safety, and welfare.
- D. The proposed project is exempt from California Environmental Quality Act.
- E. The proposed project has been found to be consistent with city standards, ordinances, and policies.

Section 4. The City Council declares that, should any provision, section, paragraph, sentence, or word of this Resolution be rendered or declared invalid by any final court action in a court of competent jurisdiction, or by reason of any preemptive legislation, the remaining provisions, sections, paragraphs, sentences and words of this Resolution shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 5. The Mayor shall sign this Resolution and the City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this Resolution.
