Rods and Rails Event Brings 20 Years of Success

PERRIS, Calif. (June 21, 2019) -- The City of Perris hosted the 20th annual Rods & Rails festival at the Orange Empire Railway Museum on June 8, 2019.

Engines were hot, the sun was shining, and good vibes were percolating as more than 2,000 residents from Perris and other surrounding cities participated in one of the most exciting events of the year. Amateur and expert car enthusiasts alike braved the heat and attended the event in appreciation for one of the best motor displays in southern California.

More than 185 cars and 26 motorcycles, some of which only leave the safe haven of their covered garages for this annual event, were featured on the Museum grounds, showing respect and admiration for decades of automobile history.

Victor M. Paredes, owner of a 2009 Harley Davidson Fatboy, had a picture of his son, a United States Marine and other United States Marine Corps decorated on the bike.

As participants traversed the rows of cars trying to narrow down a favorite or two, they were welcomed with stellar music by the Delfonics, and perhaps even a treat from one of the eight food vendors present. A potato festival, a petting zoo, some arts and crafts and even trolley rides reiterated the notion that this is truly an event for everyone.

Several participants commented on the great location of the event being at the railway museum, as plenty of shade and space for the cars were available. Participants were also able to learn about trains, trolleys and street cars.

As the sun began to reflect off the after-market chrome bumpers and warm the payment under the white-rimmed tires, Perris Mayor Michael Vargas began recognizing the magnitude of the whole day.

"This is one best events throughout the whole year," said Vargas. "It's a really well attended event and it's great to see so many of our neighboring cities join us out here with family and friends. We just couldn't have asked for a better day."
