Fifth Annual Night of Prayer Returns to Perris

More than 100 people gathered together to pray for the nation and the Perris community, offering hope and restoration for those who grieve on the heels of national tragedy, stemming from violence and hate.

Perris Council Member Rita Rogers, who started the event five years ago with Pastor Pete Perez as part of the Perris Chapter of "Cops and Clergy which was formed in 2002," hosted the event for the community.
