"Through the collaborative approach of many agencies such as Social Work Action Group, City staff and Code Enforcement, Adult Protective Services, Behavioral Health, local churches, and the Sheriff's Department, we are making strides in getting our homeless population off the streets," said Magaña. "Wraparound services are also provided to ensure that individuals who have secured stable housing do not fall into homelessness again."

She continued, "I recognize that there is no single or easy solution to address homelessness. Yet, I believe we have made progress in our collective approach to tackle the issue. These efforts are even more successful with the support of the Perris community."

Homelessness is defined as the absence of a place to live. An individual that has a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not meant for human habitation is considered to be experiencing homelessness. Anyone can experience homelessness. Although the root cause is poverty, underlying issues include: (1), Challenges with physical or mental health, (2) Violence or abuse in the home, (3) Lack of employment or (4) An inability to find affordable housing.

The launch of the Perris Cares initiative began with the unveiling of a new page on the city's website, dedicated solely to the information, awareness and attentiveness needed for a municipality to address homelessness. The webpage offers resources for those in need of assistance, a best practices list of "Dos and Don'ts" and verified lists of non-profit organizations that assist individuals experiencing homelessness. It also lists relevant findings and information from the Homelessness Subcommittee.

The City of Perris encourages compassion in addressing homelessness, while remembering the importance of approaching any situation in a safe and secure manner. In the interest of safety, it is not recommended to support or encourage panhandling. If you would like to give, please give responsibly.

The next Homelessness Subcommittee Meeting is tentatively scheduled for January 2020 with more details to come.

"The Homelessness Subcommittee is a great resource available to our community to stay updated on the advancements we are making and how to support these efforts," said Magaña.
