31st Annual Christmas Parade Returns to Perris

PERRIS, Calif. (December 17, 2019) -- An overcast and blustery winter day was not enough to hinder the 31st annual Christmas Parade that took place in the downtown district of the City on December 14, 2019.

More than 10,000 Perris residents lined the streets of downtown Perris to watch performances by 13 marching bands from local high schools in surrounding cities such as Pomona, Lake Elsinore, Moreno Valley and Menifee took part.

Viewers of the parade also got to witness classic cars and motorcycle displays, dance performances from local community groups and City-sponsored dance teams, city-staff members ride e-bicycle and e-scooters riders to promote the G.E.A.R. program, the beauty of the local equestrian units and even enjoy a visit by the Grand Marshal, good ol' Santa Claus himself.

Perris Mayor Michael Vargas and the Perris City Council were among the dignitaries riding down historic D Street en route to City Hall during the parade, each in a classic automobile, courtesy of Canyon Lake Car Club, Motte Museum and Perris Valley Auto Center, polished and shined to perfection.



The event, which feature a little more than 2,500 participants, began with an opening prayer and the pledge of allegiance by Pastor Quinn Hawley and the national anthem, sung by Sarina Gilmore, officially kicking off the event as anxious spectators watched from the sidewalks. The winter chill made for a perfect environment to enjoy a parade and Perris Mayor Michael M. Vargas, who arrived in a new 2020 Kia Optima, courtesy of the Perris Valley Auto Center, was happy to see such a turnout and is excited about the new year.

"This is a very good turnout and we couldn't have asked for better weather for a Christmas parade," said Vargas. "I want to wish everyone a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.
