## City's College Fair Inspires Students

More than 100 middle and high school students and their parents took part in the City of Perris's college fair Feb. 18, taking advantage of the opportunity to chat with college and university representatives, quiz them about course and extra-curricular activities and paths to educational and employment success.

## Making the rounds

Ebere Amadi, 16, a junior at the California Military Institute and a member of the City's Youth Advisory Committee, talked with representatives of several universities and community colleges. He plans to study statistics and political science in college. His number one choice for college? Stanford. But if that doesn't work out, Amadi said it was good to learn about other higher education options.

"This is about information gathering," Amadi said. "It's great that the City of Perris hosts events like this. It builds a stronger connection between the City and institutes of higher education."
