The Youth Advisory Committee's accomplishments are many and varied.

The group has taken part in community clean-ups, clearing trash and debris from vacant lots. They have supported City parades and major municipal events like the annual Health Fair and Senior Prom. The group began an "open mic" night at the Teen Center, allowing high school students and young adults the chance to sing, play an instrument, read poetry or speak extemporaneously. They've also organized a distracted driving workshop, an anti-bullying symposium and kicked off a "coco-and cram" night for students preparing for semester final exams.

The YAC earned the 2016 Public Outreach Award from the American Planning Association for its "Photovoice" Project," which required the committee members to capture in images areas of the City that needed improving.

YAC President Alexa Olivas, 17, will graduate from Rancho Verde High School and enter UC Irvine as a freshman in the fall, where she will study government. Upon receiving an undergraduate degree, Alexa plans to enroll in law school, with the ultimate goal of returning to Perris and helping the City thrive in the future.

"I want to give back to my community," Alexa said.

She said participating in the YAC provided her and fellow committee members with an array of skills, including public speaking, organization, how to dress professionally and effective strategies in communicating with adults.

"It's given teenagers a role in their community," she said.

The medallions presented to the YAC graduates will be worn as part of the regalia when they receive their diplomas in the coming weeks. Every member of the YAC who has served since its inception four years ago has gone on to a university.
