## Summer Ends with a Splash

And a Dilophosaurus, a 23-foot long 900-pound carnivore distinctive for its pair of rounded crests on its skull, strolled through the hundreds of visitors gathered for the annual "End of Summer Splash," the City's goodbye to those last lazy hazy days of sun and fun.

The Sept. 15 event included a jumper for children, face painting, food vendors, games for the kids and a performance from the musical group Big Band 4U.

The evening concluded with the showing of the movie "Jurassic World," the tale of a runaway genetically engineered dinosaur and the havoc it wreaks on the big screen.

"The End of Summer Splash is a great event that is always well attended and well-received," said Recreation Coordinator Rachel Pinedo, who helped organize the festivities. "It's a great opportunity for the community to enjoy fun family time and learn about our fall programs."

Upcoming programs include Perris Got Talent that begins with auditions Sept. 23 as well as the Nov. 4 Veteran's Day and Dec. 9 Christmas parades.
